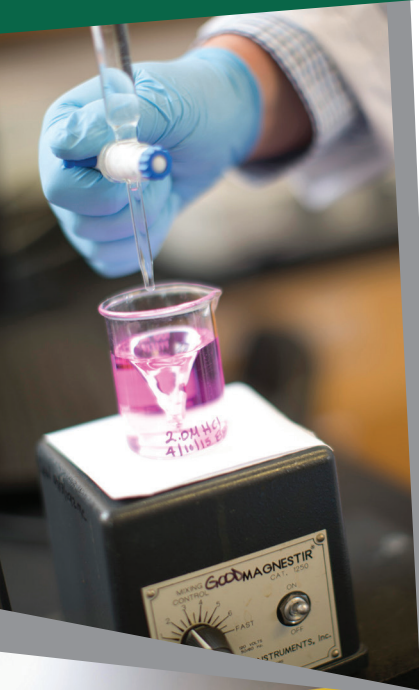

# CAREERS AND COMMUNITIES GROW with Ivy Tech Community College



## Career-Focused Programming for Students

This year, Ivy Tech Terre Haute created a team to focus on industry partnerships, and offer career coaching and advising so students can explore and prepare for their career goals. This team is just one of the ways Ivy Tech uniquely prepares students for post-graduation success. This team offers students:

- **Individual coaching** to develop their interests, strengths, and career objectives.
- **Tools to explore today's careers** that provide meaningful insight into the labor market.
- **Resources to develop employable skills** needed to become career ready in today's global workforce.
- **Support in securing career experiences** in and out of the classroom.
- **Employer connections and career opportunities** in fields of interest.

## Industry-Focused Partnerships for our Communities

Ivy Tech's core mission is to support the needs of our local industry and workforce partners. Here are just a few examples of how Ivy Tech has supported industry partners this year:

### WorkOne CNC Operator Program

The CNC operator training program was developed in conjunction with Tri Aerospace and J&N Metal Products to support a skills gap. The program includes a 225-hour training program with 12 academic credit hours and three embedded NIMS certifications. Success highlights include a 98% completion rate, 93% job placement, and 90% NIMS pass rate. This year the program also includes participants from the Federal Bureau of Prisons to help reduce recidivism.

### Elanco

Ivy Tech Terre Haute has partnered with Elanco to complete custom robotic material-handling training. Since its inception, seven cohorts have completed the program. The training includes Fanuc material-handling content and the Fanuc Handling Tool Basic Programming Certification. The spring cohort continued the 100% pass rate since the program's inception.

### Brampton Brick Leadership Path

As Brampton Brick began expanding shifts at its Sullivan County location, the company wanted to leverage existing talent and promote team members to managers and supervisors. Ivy Tech created a customized three-tier leadership curriculum for newly appointed leaders, which focuses on conflict resolution, empathy, and other key skills. This spring, the inaugural cohort of 15 individuals completed the first tier of the program.

### Department of Labor Registered Apprenticeship Programs

- **Automotive Apprenticeship Program** — This registered apprenticeship program, which just completed the pilot year, is tailored to meet the workforce demands by recruiting and training skilled automotive technicians. Toyota of Terre Haute and Terre Haute Chevy each had an apprentice and both students were offered full-time employment as automotive technicians.
- **GE Aviation** — In collaboration with GE Aviation, Vigo County School Corporation, and WorkOne, Ivy Tech developed a registered apprenticeship program in the field of machining at GE Aviation. Once the program is approved by GE Aviation, up to five high school seniors can enroll in the program each spring semester to begin on-the-job training.
- **Union Hospital** — Ivy Tech, WorkOne, and Union Health launched a nursing apprenticeship program, which will allow up to 10 nursing students to participate in an experiential learning program. This year, seven students were selected to begin on-the-job training while completing their coursework. At Union Health, students complete modules that are aligned with the topics they are studying in the classroom. In addition to Union Health funding the educational costs, students also receive a generous living stipend and uniform allowance. Union Health is poised to make full-time employment offers following the completion of the program.

In its third year, the Bowen Scholars Program welcomes 20 Black or African American students to Ivy Tech Terre Haute each academic year. Funded by Bob and Terry Bowen, recipients receive a \$2,000 scholarship each year for up to two years and participate in cohort-style programming focused on honing leadership and professional skills.

### Enrollment by County

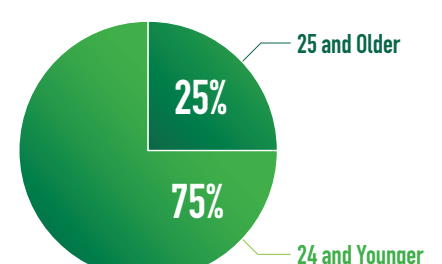
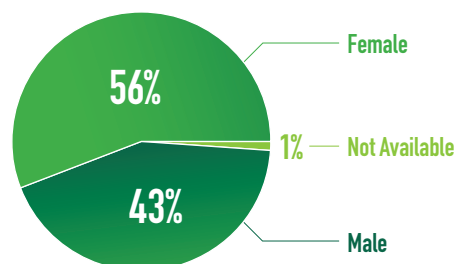

Ivy Tech Terre Haute experienced an increase in students from outside of West Central Indiana, partially due to its Pathway to Blue Program. Pathway to Blue is a partnership program with Indiana State University that allows select students to ease into the college experience by taking Ivy Tech classes their first year. Students live in the ISU residence halls, receive all the resources offered at Ivy Tech and ISU, and are fully immersed in the ISU student-life experience.

Thanks to Ivy Tech dual-credit opportunities in our local high schools, 22% of graduates were high school students from 27 schools in the West Central Indiana. Often high school students can earn enough college credits before graduating high school to start as a sophomore at any Indiana public four-year college, drastically reducing their educational costs.
