





CLAY COUNTY

Prestigious Chancellor's Award Scholarship Awarded to Northview High School Student

Sophie Stallcop began pursing her associate degree in nursing in August of 2024, after earning the Chancellor's Award Scholarship. The prestigious scholarship covers full tuition, fees, and books for four semesters. Locally, lvy Tech awards nearly \$400,000 in scholarships annually, helping 82% of students graduate without student debt.

PARKE COUNTY

Welding Art Takes Center Stage at the Statehouse

Ivy Tech welding students in the Wabash River Career and Technical Education program took part in the Nucor Art Project, with their sculpture selected for display at the Indiana Statehouse. In April, student representatives traveled to Indianapolis to showcase their work and meet with Indiana Secretary of Education Dr. Katie Jenner. This honor highlights the talent and craftsmanship of Ivy Tech welding students and reinforces the college's role in preparing the next generation of skilled professionals.



PUTNAM COUNTY

Nursing Expansion at Ivy Tech Greencastle Aims to Address Workforce Needs

In November 2024, Ivy Tech Greencastle opened a state-of-the-art Nursing Simulation Center, made possible by a generous gift from the Putnam County Community Foundation. The center features advanced AI mannequins for hands-on, life-like training. In addition, Ivy Tech Greencastle now offers both a nursing and practical nursing program preparing students for careers as registered nurses (RN) or licensed practical nurses (LPN).



In early 2025, Ivy Tech and North Putnam High School launched a new academic pathway that allows eligible students to earn an Ivy Tech associate degree in general studies before graduating high school at no cost. Through a combination of Indiana College Core (ICC) coursework and additional dual credit classes, students can complete all 60 required credit hours on-site at the high school, earning both high school and Ivy Tech credit. This innovative partnership gives students a valuable head start on their college education and saves students and their families thousands of dollars in tuition costs.



SULLIVAN COUNTY

Career Navigator Guides Sullivan Students Toward Bright Futures

Through a partnership between Ivy Tech and Southwest School Corporation, and funded by Indiana's Career Coaching Grant, a full-time Career Navigator now supports students in Sullivan County. Serving primarily at Sullivan High School, Mackenzie Colegrove also provides programming at Sullivan Middle School and assists with Ivy Tech's college fair. Since starting her role, Colegrove has helped students of all ages embark on college and career exploration through college visits, guest speakers, vision boards, and hands-on activities to help them plan their futures.





VERMILLION COUNTY

High School Senior Takes First Place in Automotive Skills Contest

In April, Ivy Tech's School of Advanced Manufacturing, Engineering, and Applied Science welcomed nearly 200 high-school competitors to its annual Automotive Skills Contest, where students rotated through hands-on diagnostics stations, a written knowledge exam, and industry-sponsored breakout sessions. Presented in partnership with Thompson's Honda and Toyota of Terre Haute, and backed by Belle Tire and NAPA, the event showcased local automotive career pathways while connecting students directly with Ivy Tech faculty and partnering employers. South Vermillion High School senior Logan Fiock emerged as the top overall finisher, earning a professional NAPA toolbox,

state-of-the-art tools, and a \$1,000 scholarship to

Ivy Tech Terre Haute.

VIGO COUNTY

Saturn Petcare and Ivy Tech Partner for Industrial Technology Apprenticeship Program

In August 2024, Ivy Tech partnered with Saturn Petcare to launch a new apprenticeship program through the Achieve Your Degree (AYD) initiative. At a special signing ceremony, three Saturn Petcare employees began their journey toward earning a tuition-free associate degree in Industrial Technology from Ivy Tech. The program combines on-the-job experience with classroom learning, supporting workforce development and strengthening career pathways in the Terre Haute community.

Battery Workforce Challenge Names Year Two Championship Teams

lvy Tech, in partnership with Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology, earned third place in the prestigious Battery Workforce Challenge, a national collegiate competition focused on battery innovation and workforce development. Held in Indianapolis in May 2025, year two of the three-year competition challenged students to design and develop electric vehicle battery systems for a Ram ProMaster commercial van. Ivy Tech students worked alongside Rose-Hulman engineering peers, gaining hands-on experience with real-world applications in battery architecture, software, and safety systems. The event, supported by the U.S. Department of Energy and Stellantis, highlights Ivy Tech's growing role in preparing students for high-demand careers in advanced manufacturing and the electric vehicle industry.

Ivy Tech and Vigo County School Corporation Launch TechQuest, Empowering Rising 8th-Graders with Future Career Exploration

In June, Ivy Tech and Vigo County School Corporation (VCSC) hosted TechQuest, a week-long summer camp for rising 8th-grade students, supported by the Ivy Tech Foundation and the Vigo County Education Foundation. During the camp, participants engaged in hands-on activities across high-demand career fields such as robotics, machine tool technology, welding, diesel and automotive technology, electronics, healthcare, precision agriculture, and computer science. Transportation and lunch were provided daily to ensure equitable access. Molly Joseph, Ivy Tech's dean of Advanced Manufacturing, Engineering, and Applied Science, praised the program for offering "early and meaningful career exploration," while VCSC superintendent Dr. Chris Himsel said it helped students feel more confident and informed about choosing an educational path as they enter high school.

Ivy Tech Terre Haute/Greencastle Names Julie Will as New Vice Chancellor of Academic Affairs

Julie Will was appointed vice chancellor of academic affairs at Ivy Tech Terre Haute/Greencastle in January 2025, following the retirement of Dr. Deanna King after 31 years of dedicated service. Will brings over two decades of leadership in higher education, most recently serving as dean of Health Sciences and Public Affairs, and serves as the campus's strategic plan lead. Her appointment marks a continued commitment to student success and academic innovation.

In October 2024, Ivy Tech Terre Haute hosted its annual agriculture and engineering challenge, welcoming more than 500 high school students from across the region for a day of hands-on competitions in areas such as agricultural-use drones, biotechnology, and engineering. The event kicked off with a keynote address from former USDA Undersecretary for Trade and Foreign Agricultural Affairs Ted McKinney, and included insights into the critical role agriculture plays in the local and national landscape.

Ivy Tech Earns Grant to Boost Early Childhood Education

In December 2024, Ivy Tech was awarded a Lilly Endowment Early Childhood Education Grant to strengthen Indiana's early childhood workforce. Locally, the grant will fund innovative programs such as Safe Sitter certification camps, dual credit and dual enrollment partnerships, and professional development opportunities, including an apprenticeship program, for future and current childcare providers. Through these initiatives, lvy Tech Terre Haute will expand access, increase enrollment, and support student success in early childhood education pathways across West Central Indiana.
